

- 10.**Jaivom** Project- for promoting the organic farming, NSS volunteers took part in the Campaign for transforming Kottayam District to a '100% Literacy District in Organic Farming'. In connection with this programme the volunteers participated in the Seven Day Camp held at Kanjirappally Panchayath-organized by MG University and bagged Organic Literacy Drive- Best Unit / Programme Officers Award in Pathanamthitta District.
